## **Biathlon Ontario Award Policy**

The Biathlon Ontario Achievement Awards are a series of annual awards designed to recognize outstanding athletes, coaches, officials and clubs who have excelled in our sport during the previous calendar year. Nominees may be recognized for participating in local, provincial, national, or international competitions.

An \* indicates an Award that nominations are to be made in writing by any Biathlon Ontario member in good standing, at any time throughout the year no less than 30 days prior to AGM to VP Tech or VP Administration and should contain a short description of how each nominee fulfills the corresponding Award criteria.

All other Awards are recommended by CADC.

All Awards are approved by the Biathlon Awards Selection Committee.

### **\* BiON Volunteer of the Year Award**

The BiON Volunteer of the Year Award is awarded annually to a Biathlon Ontario member selected from the pool of nominations received throughout the year, who has made significant contributions to the sport of biathlon and truly exemplifies the volunteer spirit.

### **\*BiON Club Official of the Year Award**

The BiON Official of the Year Award is presented annually to a Biathlon Ontario member selected from the pool of nominations received throughout the year, who has significantly contributed to the officiating of biathlon competitions across the O' Cup series of provincial events. This individual respects the rules and regulations of Biathlon while demonstrating a philosophy of fair play and sport development.

### **\*BiON Coach of the Year Award**

The BiON Coach of the Year Award is presented annually to the Biathlon Ontario Coach selected from the pool of nominations received throughout the year, who demonstrates respect for officials, opponents, and parents while espousing a philosophy of fair play. This coach demonstrates concern for the all-round development of the athlete, and instills guidelines reflecting responsible conduct beyond the playing field. Furthermore, this coach presents by example, a positive image of coaching, applies relevant training theory and coaching techniques, and demonstrates the ability to improve the athletic performance of a team or individual.

### **BiON Athlete of the Year Award**

The BiON Athlete of the Year Award is presented annually to an Ontario athlete competing in any IBU category (Youth Women, Youth Men, Junior Women, Junior Men, Women, or Men) who demonstrates personal achievement and excellence and, by example, a positive image as an athlete and being a good ambassador for the sport of Biathlon and the province of Ontario. Awards are presented to athletes who have achieved the best results in international competition and the Canadian Championships as determined by the BiON CADC.

### **BiON Most Improved Athlete of the Year Award**

The BiON Most Improved Athlete of the Year Award is presented annually to an Ontario athlete competing in any IBU category or Biathlon Canada Sr Boy & Girl category who demonstrates the largest performance improvement from previous years achievements at National Team selection events and or National Championships as determined by the BiON CADC.

### **BiON Senior Athlete Award**

The BiON Senior Athlete Award is presented annually to the top competitor in both the Senior Boy and Senior Girl .22 race category. Athletes eligible for this award must have competed in the Ontario .22 Championship and National Championships. Their final points standing will be based on their best 3 of 4 results from these events as determined by the BiON CADC.

### **BiON Hurley Cup Award**

The Hurley Cup recognizes performance over the course of our season-long intra-provincial air rifle competition series. This award is presented annually to the top competitor in both the Junior Boy and Junior Girl category. Athletes eligible for this award will have competed in at least four sanctioned O' Cup races that season, including the Ontario Air Rifle Championship (OARC): their final points standing being based on their results from the OARC and top two results from any other O' Cup event as determined by the BiON CADC.

### **BiON Juvenile Cup Award**

The BiON Juvenile Cup recognizes performance over the course of our season-long intra-provincial air rifle competition series. This award is presented annually to the top competitor in both the Juvenile Boy and Juvenile Girl category. Athletes eligible for this award will have competed in at least four sanctioned O' Cup races that season including the Ontario Air Rifle Championship (OARC): their final points standing being based on their results from the OARC and top two results from any other O' Cup event as determined by the BiON CADC.

### Perfect Shot Award

The Perfect Shot Award is presented annually to the athlete scoring the greatest number of clean shooting rounds in provincial & national biathlon competition (eg. O' Cup, Q-Cup, NorAm, National Championship). Separate trophies are awarded for Air Rifle and .22 caliber shooters as determined by the BiON CADAC.

### BiON Top Club Award

The BiON Top Club Award is presented annually to the Biathlon Ontario club earning the greatest number of individual athlete points that season. BiON Top Club points are determined by the combined individual points of all athletes competing for their club across all identified sanctioned events as determined by the BiON CADAC.

### O' Cup Series

The Ontario Cup (O' Cup) air rifle series of events represents the most universal opportunity for provincial competitions given Ontario's present lack of .22 caliber biathlon facilities. This series serves as a vehicle for athlete development and talent identification, and also as a mechanism for Ontario Winter Games selection. O' Cup events may, on occasion, be held in conjunction with other events, such as a NorAm Cups, Quebec Cups, or Provincial Championships. Each year, Biathlon Ontario strives to schedule events in a variety of venues all around the province.

- Points are awarded to competitors in all categories, according to the points schedule below.

- Points are awarded only to members of Biathlon Ontario registered in a competitive category;
  - Recreational and out-of-province athletes are welcome to compete in O' Cup events but are not eligible for points.
  - Points are awarded to Biathlon Ontario athletes as per finish position; athletes will not be awarded points for a higher placing with respect to other ineligible

athletes (i.e. final standings will not be re-worked to account for positions earned by Recreational or out-of-province athletes in that category).

- Ties in the final standing will be broken as follows: number of wins, number of second places, number of third places, number of fourth places .... If a tie still remains, it will be broken by number of points earned at the Provincial Championship (either OARC or Ont .22 Champs).
