Official training will take place for the NorAm athletes the morning of Friday, November 30. Plan accordingly for early snow on limited trails unless we are fortunate to have early cold weather to benefit making of snow.

The Event fees include the trail and range passes for the athletes when they complete the registration on line. Please fill out all the questions on the registration form so we can provide you with a quality experience at our event. All range use must be booked by emailing <u>cnc.biathlon@gov.ab.ca</u> for the days prior to November 30, 2017 and after December 2.

Only Range Safety Officers registered with the Canmore Nordic Centre are able to reserve lanes. You must have a Range Safety Officer on site during your practice time and that can be arranged through contact with our organizing committee. If you are coming early, please drop us a note to let us know.

Eligibility to Compete:

Competitors from all IBU member NFs will be eligible to participate in NAC events. However, only members of the teams of the host continent NFs will be eligible to be Continental Champions and medalists. Participation quotas may be set by respective BNA. Competitors must be prepared to show a membership card or otherwise demonstrate proof of such membership for the current year as part of the event registration and entry process. For Canadian Citizens, it is mandatory that all athletes have in their possession, and be able to show upon request their (PAL) or their Minor's Permit, which are firearms licenses issued by the Government of Canada.

Citizenship and Residency (as per IBU constitution):

The IBU Rules with respect to the Nationality of Athletes will be used to determine any question of eligibility, for reasons of citizenship, of any athlete entered into a competition that is conducted under this Policy. As an additional requirement under this Policy, an athlete may represent only one Division or Region within a single competition season. There are no residency restrictions under this Policy.

Competition Ability:

Any Division or Region registering a Competitor for any SBNACH, NACH or NAC event tacitly guarantees that the Competitor is fully able to compete at the international level.

Non-Resident Firearms Declaration Process:

Teams and individual competitors from outside of Canada must declare their rifles at the Canadian border, complete the necessary documentation, and pay the required fees when bringing rifles and ammunition into Canada. All athletes must register their own rifles and pay the applicable \$25 CDN fee. Refer to the government website at http://www.rcmp-grc.gc.ca/cfp-pcaf/fs-fd/visit-visite-eng.htm for guidelines. Ammunition:

Wapiti Sports in Canmore can order Lapua with enough time ahead and stocks a limited amount of RWS Target. <u>http://wapitisports.com/hunting-firearms/</u> Calgary has two sporting goods stores that will have target ammunition from Federal, Winchester, CCI, Remington but not Lapua. <u>Make sure to bring enough with you for your training and competition needs.</u>

REGISTRATION:

On-Line Registration on Zone4 will open November 2, 2018. Go to <u>www.biathlon.ca</u> and follow the links or to <u>https://zone4.ca/register.asp?id=19455&lan=1&cartlevel=1</u>.

Payment must be made using a credit card (Visa or Master Card). On line charge will apply.

On-line registration closes on Wednesday November 28, 2018 at 23:59 MST. No Registration will be taken on site. All Competitors MUST have a 2018/2019 membership for their Division or State/Nation. Proof of membership is required to compete.

Enter the registration number in the membership field (USBA competitor's use 'USBA' in the membership field) Enter your registration number of your annual pass in the field for annual CNCPP ski pass (Not Frozen Thunder pass) Enter your number in the field for annual CNCPP .22 range pass.

Competition fees for this North American Cup #1 / Calforex Biathlon Cup #1 concurrent competitions include ski pass and range pass fees for the event for Nov 30th training day, Dec 1st competition day and Dec 2nd competition day for those athletes without an annual ski and range pass. Any other days will be the responsibility of the athlete.

Development 1 and 2 competition fees per day include range and ski pass for those without an annual pass for either Saturday and/or Sunday. Fees also include wax room rentals, trail preparation, rental of the timing building, and the rental of the stadium plus equipment required to host the event.

The fines for skiing without a pass or using the range without a pass are very steep and to be avoided. Season pass holders must have their passes available. Athletes without season passes will be provided their passes when their coach comes to pick up their team wax key. The pass will be for the two-day event or the three-day event inclusively. No free replacements will be issued if the pass is lost. You may purchase a new event pass from our biathlon event office.

Passes for the extra days (those not included in the competition fees) or a monthly range pass can be purchased at the Day Lodge Guest Services Window from 9am to 5pm 7 days a week or season passes can be purchased on line at http://www.albertaparks.ca/canmore-nordic-centre/activities-events/cross-country-skiing.aspx click 'trail use fees' to see the prices for both the ski passes and the range passes in Canadian Dollars.

When arriving early inform the CNCPP Day Lodge staff if you are participating in the NorAm event so they do not sell you more day passes then you need. They do not give refunds of daily passes and they are date specific.

Cancellation Policy in Effect: If the event is cancelled due to severe cold weather, three days before the event then a 50% refund of registration fees will be refunded by Biathlon Alberta on behalf of the hosting clubs.

If the event is cancelled on the competition weekend due to severe cold weather or force majeure, no refund of registration fees will be made.

If an athlete withdraws before the registration deadline then a \$10 processing fee will apply before a refund is sent.

COMPETITIONS:

Saturday: Sprint (2016 IBU rules)

Sunday: Pursuit* (NorAm Hosting Policy for IBU categories and Biathlon Alberta Hosting Policy for those in the Calforex Cup categories)

Pursuit* Competition will be conducted with a fixed 5-sec interval between competitors, with the start order based on the designated qualifying competition from the same event. The cumulative 5-sec gaps between competitors in a given class are the handicaps that must be overcome in order to win the competition. Athletes who have not taken part in, or who did not successfully complete, the qualifying competition may compete in the Pursuit Competition as unqualified entries. Unqualified entries will start after all qualified entries and grouped together with a random draw for start lane assignments. Firing points will be assigned to each competitor as they enter the range for each bout of shooting.

COMPETITION OFFICE:

Located upstairs in the Biathlon Timing building by the range. Hours will be Thursday afternoon 1600-1800, Friday 0800-1800, Saturday 0800-1800, Sunday 0800-1700. Office volunteers may be at the location for awards during award times.

VOLUNTEER CHECK-IN:

Located upstairs in the Biathlon Timing building. At the rear of the biathlon parking lot go up the outside stairs and enter the first door of the building.

WAX ROOMS:

The wax room building is situated next to the wax testing area and the biathlon stadium.

There is a refundable deposit of \$100 (cash or cheque only) for the key(s) to the wax room. The daily fee of \$20 for use of the wax room is included with registration for the 2 event days <u>only</u>. Other days of wax room use will be paid for by the team using the room. Athlete numbers will determine room assignment. Note: Biathlon Alberta Hosting Policy Section 1.7 will apply:

1.7 WAXING REGULATION In order to minimize the costs associated with waxing for clubs and families and to allow coaches to spend more time with their athletes on race weekends, all Alberta Cup and Alberta Provincial Championship events shall be subject to the following Waxing Regulation: Regulation: Only low fluoro or no fluoro waxes may be used to prepare skis. Medium to high fluoro waxes, high fluoro speed blocks and powders are not allowed. The use of hand structure on skis is allowed. Exception: On race weekends when North American (NORAM) Cup and Calforex Cup competitions are being held at the same time, these regulations will apply to the following categories: Senior Boys and Girls, Dev 1 and 2 Boys and Girls and Air Rifle 1 and 2 Boys and Girls. IBU Categories at NORAM Cup competitions will not be subject to this Regulation.

TIMING:

Transponders, Summit systems and the Kurvinen target system will be used during this event to provide the results.

TUNNELS:

Please help us maintain our snow by only walking in designated walk areas. Tunnels are to be used for the entire competition to keep the snow in good skiable condition. Entrance tunnels from the parking lot to the equipment check and then to the range will be used for the entire competition. Volunteers will use the same tunnels. Use skis in the stadium, course and range. Leave all extra bags, equipment and clothing in the team rooms.

RANGE:

In the interest of the safety of those working on the range, please remove all personal belongings including skis from the range at the end of Zero. Any items left on the range will be removed prior to the start of the competition.

COURSE MAPS:

Course Maps will be provided upon arrival. Courses used will be dependent on the natural snow and the condition of the man-made snow provided by the staff of the Nordic Centre. CNC staff will provide the best case for the conditions available for our event. Please remember that early snow conditions are never perfect and plan accordingly for equipment needs.

Masters wishing to qualify for the National Championship must register in Masters Men/Women 35+ Athletes using these competitions as trials for their divisional Canada Winter Games teams can register and compete in the necessary category.

RIFLE CARRYING:

- Senior Boys and Girls categories will carry their rifles only on the range (see non-carry procedure in Annex A-3 of the Canadian Hosting Policy http://biathloncanada.ca/wp-content/uploads/2016/06/Canadian-Hosting-Policy-2016-17.pdf) and will shoot in the prone and standing positions.
- Non-carry procedure will be done by the clubs for their athletes.
- Masters, Adult Rec. and Sport Men/Women must indicate to the OC 30 minutes before ZEROING, if they are NOT carrying and therefore, using the non-carry procedure so rifle racks can be provided at the entrance of the range.
- Dev. 1 and 2 categories will have their rifles placed on the mat by their coaches and will shoot only in the prone position.

AWARDS:

Awards will be presented outside in the Stadium area immediately after final results are posted.

Medals for both competitions and NA cup points will be awarded regardless of the number of participants in a class.

Veli Niinimaa Awards will be presented during the medal presentations after each competition day for those having clean bouts of shooting. All competitors are eligible for shooting awards.

NorAm Cup and Calforex Cup winners will be awarded points to count towards the overall total of each Cup for eligible categories.

CANMORE NORDIC CENTRE:
